J.J. is an amazing motivational speaker, executive leadership coach, and master trainer of Dale Carnegie Training. He talked with the attendees about ways to ignite our

- March 23, 2017: Women's History Month "Honoring Trailblazing Women in Labor and Business" Held at Pennhall Training Facility, speaker April Connel.
